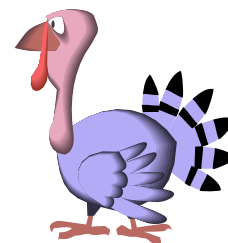

MT. ANGEL WOODCARVERS – Submitted by Dave Disselbrett

At the last Capital Woodcarvers meeting, some showed interest in the Mt Angel Woodcarvers. This is an attempt to give you a short background and information about joining or being part of the Mt Angel Woodcarvers.

The Mt Angel Woodcarvers was formed July 2008 as a co-op of artist. We opened a store in Mt Angel at 125 N Garfield. Presently there are about twelve co-op members and about thirty other artists that have items displayed for sale in the gallery.

The membership/participation levels are in three categories.

1. Monthly Dues of \$50.00 per person - with this level, there is no commission charge on any sales of your items from the Gallery.
2. Monthly Dues of \$25.00 per person - with this level, there is a 25% commission fee on any sales of your items from the Gallery.
3. No monthly fee - with this level, there is a 40% commission charge on any sales of your items from the Gallery.

As a dues paying member, we ask that you assist in Gallery sitting during each month. You would be allowed to conduct classes and participate in the decisions of Gallery.

The Mt Angel Woodcarvers meet at 5:00 PM the 4th Monday each month at the shop in Mt Angel. If you are interested in joining or being involved, the office manager is Kenny Wilson and he can be reached at the shop in Mt Angel Tuesday thru Sunday.

If you are interested selling some of your carvings, and want them on sale every day, this is an opportunity. If you have any questions, contact Kenny Wilson, Dave Disselbrett, Jim Harris or Sam Hutchinson as they are all members of the Mt Angel Woodcarvers.
